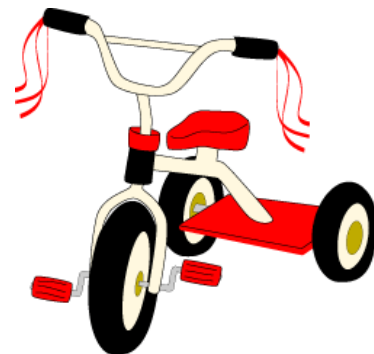
The Increasing Trends of Hyperglycemia & Type 2 Diabetes in Children

NYS Medication Administration Training (MAT)
