CEO BECOMES A CERTIFIED COMMUNITY ACTION PROFESSIONAL

Diane Hewitt-Johnson, Chautaugua Opportunities, Inc.'s CEO, recently achieved status as a Certified Community Action Professional (CCAP). Diane was among 112 CCAP graduates who were recognized in August 2024 at the National Community Action Partnership (NCAP) Annual Conference in Seattle, Washington. The CCAP credential recognizes those who demonstrate knowledge and application of the core competencies required to effectively carry out the vision, mission, purpose and values of the Community Action movement.

The process for earning certification consists of a period of study followed by a proctored, online exam and a rigorous, independent research and writing assignment on a specific topic. Candidates must pass both components to earn certification. Diane was able to earn the certification within six months, although candidates are allowed three years to complete it. Certification remains current for four years, during which time there is a requirement for continuing education.

Individuals pursuing the CCAP are provided with guidance in leading the Community Action Agency, positioning (con't on page 2)

(con't from page 1) it to effectively serve the best interests of people in poverty. In addition to increasing her knowledge of community action practices and strengthening leadership skills, Diane's aspirations include becoming a mentor for other community action professionals across the country.

Diane Hewitt-Johnson became the interim CEO of Chautauqua Opportunities, Inc. in 2018, followed by appointment as CEO six months later. She earned a Bachelor of Science degree

in Management from Houghton College and a Master of Science in Strategic Leadership from Roberts Wesleyan College, where she also received the Distinguished Leadership Award. She completed an Associates in Applied Science in Business Administration at Jamestown Community College. Diane currently serves on the Board of Directors of the nationwide organization CAPLAW (Community Action Program Legal Services, Inc.), and is the Vice-President on the Board of the NYS Community Action Association (NYSCAA).

COI has been in existence since 1965 and is the federally designated Community Action Agency (CAA) in Chautauqua County. It is one of over 1,100 Community Action Agencies across the country, including 47 in NY State. COI is tasked with providing innovative services to individuals and families to help them achieve economic security, while partnering with other agencies to ensure a comprehensive approach is taken to deliver holistic services. The agency will celebrate its 60th anniversary in 2025.

Summer Food Service Program was a Huge Summer Success!



COI's Summer Food Service Program offers free, healthy meals and snacks for children and teens ages 18 and under at gathering points such as parks, community centers, schools, and libraries throughout the county. The purpose of the program is to ensure that children are provided with nutritious food during the summer months when school is not in session. New for 2024, sites had the option of providing "grab and go" meals and snacks for families to take and eat at home, resulting in healthy meals being distributed to many more children than in past years. COI collaborated with 26 sites to provide meals, and 14 of them offered the grab and go option. Meals include fruits, vegetables, grains, and protein.


COI prepared and delivered a total of 19,885 breakfasts, 20,000 lunches, and 6,416 snacks that were eaten by the children at partnering community sites. Additionally, 979 breakfasts, 15,248 lunches, and 7,846 snacks were distributed to families as grab and go meals to be eaten at home.

One new site this year, a private rental complex for low-income families, turned out to be a huge success. A resident of the complex reached out to inquire about the program after she noticed that many children were going without a good food source during the summer. She found herself struggling to provide not only for her own family, but also for many of the other children. This tenant volunteered her time every day to open the recreational room in the complex to receive meals and provide an open site for distribution. Through word of mouth, news of the program soon spread to other families who started coming to the open site. This site alone provided 3,797 lunches and 3,797 snacks throughout July and August. The volunteer also provided an occasional activity for the children to do during the lunch distribution. COI truly appreciates her assistance in making sure children are provided with healthy food.

COI's goal for 2025 is to encourage more sites to offer grab and go meals and snacks so that the program is able to reach more children. Funding for the program is provided by the U.S. Department of Agriculture.


