

On 8/15/24, volunteers from member agencies of the Continuum of Care (CoC) and staff of the City of Jamestown conducted a Point in Time (PIT) count of homeless persons throughout Chautauqua County. The number of homeless on that day included 160 households who were in shelters and 55 individuals who were unsheltered and living on the street, in the woods, in parks, under bridges, or in abandoned buildings.

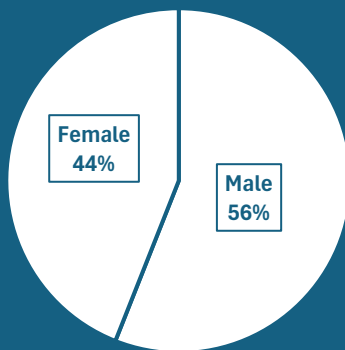

Dunkirk: 2

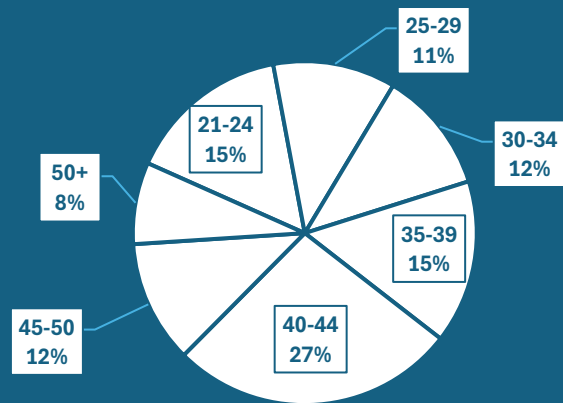
Fredonia: 1

27 unsheltered individuals were surveyed by volunteers. Their responses are reflected in the following data.

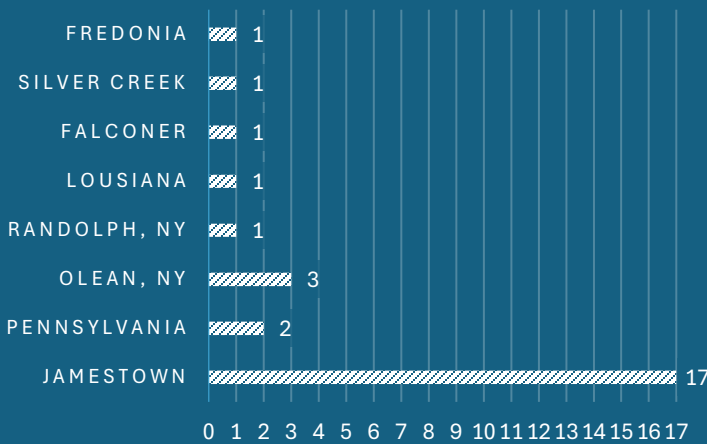

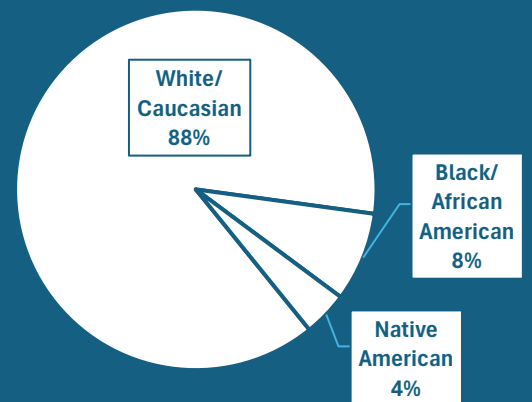
AGE



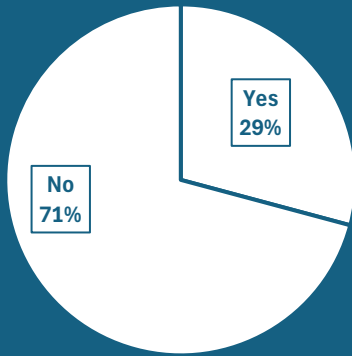
LAST PLACE OF RESIDENCE



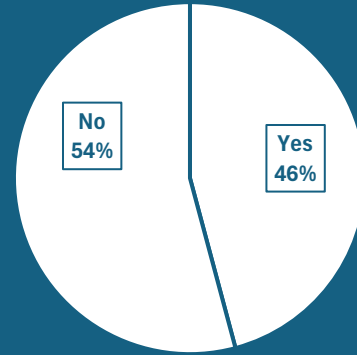
RACE



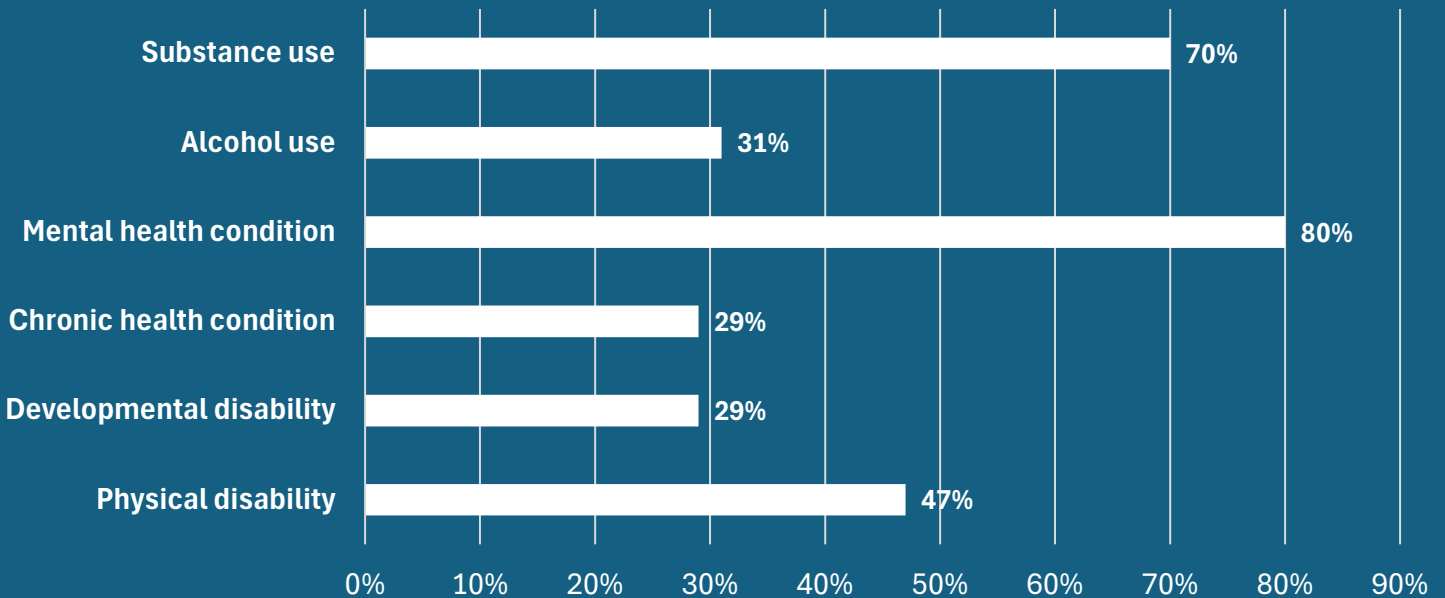
DOMESTIC VIOLENCE VICTIM
